We have seen several students with runny noses and coughs. Please remember that if students have any of the following symptoms, they will need to stay home: fever, runny nose, cough, vomiting or diarrhea. Students must be fever free for 72 hours without medication. We understand that students may have allergies and we will take

that into consideration. We also understand that the common cold and flu season is upon us. We would like to stay vigilant and encourage students to stay home when not feeling well. Thank you for understanding.

The following is a recommendation from Leon County Schools:

Too sick for school?

Deciding when a child is too sick to go to school can be a difficult decision to make. When trying to decide, use these guidelines to help make the best decision.

- Fever: Keep a child home if they have a temperature of 100 degrees or higher.
- Sore throat: Be mindful of sore throats, especially those with a fever or swollen glands in the neck.
- Diarrhea: Three or more loose stools in 24 hour period.
- Vomiting: Keep a child home if they've thrown up two or more times in a 24 hour period.
- Rash: Watch for rashes, especially those that cause a fever, itching or swelling.
- Chronic cough and/or green nose discharge: These conditions may be contagious and require treatment. Please visit your healthcare provid-
